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Rased issues its report on monitoring government performance within three Year

- 731 commitments by the Al-Khasawneh Government after three years of its formation.
- Bani Amer: RASED launches a program to measure the impact of accomplished priorities.
- 441 priorities for the Al-Khasawneh Government during the years 2023–2025 within the Priorities of the Economic Modernization Vision; 7% of them were completed, 83% are being implemented, and 10% have not started yet.
- Investment, agriculture, water, digital economy, and agricultural lending have the highest implementation of the Economic Modernization Vision priorities.
- 51 priorities for the Al-Khasawneh government during the year 2023 within the Public Sector Modernization; 29% of them were completed, 65% are being implemented, and 6% have not started yet.
- 79 commitments by the Al-Khasawneh government within the Government Executive Program (2021-2024), 56% of them were completed, 35% are being implemented, and 9% have not started yet.
- 160 commitments by the Al-Khasawneh government within the Program of the Governmental Economic Priorities, (2021-2023), 63% were completed, 31% are being implemented, and 6% have not started yet.
- Appointment of 117 individuals in leadership positions during three years.
- 997 decisions were taken by the government during three years.
- Kreishan, Al Nabulsi, Mahafzah, Al Henefat, and Al Shamali achieved the highest number of activities in the last six months.
- 462 travel trips for members of the Al-Khasawneh government during three years.
- Local Administration ministry has the highest number of posts on Facebook, and Education ministry has the highest interaction.
- 1% of viewers of government posts on Facebook interact with them.
- 58 ministers in the Al-Khasawneh government during 3 years, including 9 ministers from the initial formation.



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The results of the report by Al-Hayat Center-RASED on monitoring the performance of Dr. Bishr Al-Khasawneh's government after three years of its formation indicated that the government committed to 731 commitments. These commitments were distributed across four main programs, namely Government Executive Program (2021-2024), Government's Economic Priorities Program 2021-2023, the Economic Modernization Vision (2023-2025), and the Public Sector Modernization (2022-2025).

General Director of Al-Hayat Center-RASED, Amer Bani Amer, stated that RASED has launched a special program to measure the impact of accomplished priorities in general, and digital services in particular. This step comes as part of the development of the government's performance monitoring methodology within the plans prepared by the government. Bani Amer confirmed that periodic reports will be published on the impact of priorities that have been implemented, such as some digital services. Bani Amer added that the methodology of the report relied on variables associated with the evidence, where the report team conducted qualitative and quantitative research and collected information from multiple sources such as search engines and the websites of ministries, and the communication was made with all ministries.

The results showed that the number of priorities within the Economic Modernization Vision that were supposed to be accomplished during the years 2023-2025 reached 441 commitments. Of these, 7% have been completed, 10% have not yet started, and 83% are currently being implemented. The results also indicated that the percentage of commitments being implemented is high for 11%, moderate for 26%, and low for 63%. Regarding the responsible entities for implementing the priorities of the Economic Modernization Vision, it was found that the Ministry of Investment had the highest number of completed priorities with 6, followed by the Ministry of Agriculture with 4, and then the Ministry of Water and Irrigation, the Ministry of Digital Economy and Entrepreneurship, and the Agricultural Credit Corporation with 3 priorities each.

Within the Public Sector Modernization, there were 51 priorities during the year 2023. 29% of them have been completed, 6% have not yet started, and work is underway to implement 65% of them. It was found that 27% of commitments are being implemented at a high level, 42% at a moderate level, while 30% of commitments are being implemented at a low level.

The Government Executive Program (2021-2024) included 79 commitments. 56% of them have been complet-

ed, 9% have not yet started, and the ongoing implementation of commitments has reached 35%. The ongoing commitments has been classified into three levels of implementation: high implementation at 46%, moderate implementation at 39%, and 14% being implemented at a low level.

The number of commitments within the Government's Economic Priorities Program (2021-2023) reached 160 commitments. 63% of them have been completed, and work has not yet started on 6% of them. The percentage of ongoing commitments being implemented is 31%, with 41% being implemented at a high level, 45% at a moderate level, and 14% at a low level.

Regarding the decisions issued by the Al-Khasawneh government, they reached 997 decisions during its three years of formation. An analysis of the decisions showed that the legislative pillar had the highest percentage at 33%, followed by the administrative pillar and the financial and economic pillar with equal percentages of 23% of the total decisions. 10% of the decisions were related to the development and services pillar, 9% were related to the appointments pillar, and finally, the international agreements and treaties pillar accounted for 3% of the decisions.

The decisions of appointment to leadership positions issued by the Council of Ministers amounted to 94 decisions over three years. 117 individuals were appointed based on these decisions. It is worth noting that these appointments are for leadership positions. The report also showed that the number of trips taken by the members of the Al-Khasawneh government from 12/10/2020 to 11/10/2023 reached 462 trips. The percentage of trips with declared destinations was 61%, while the percentage of trips with undisclosed destinations was 39%.

The report's working team tracked all the activities of the Al-Khasawneh government members over the three years. The total number of field activities reached 5082 activities, forming 56% of the total activities. The total number of office activities reached 4072 activities, forming 44%. The overall total of activities during the three years of the government's tenure was 9154 activities, with 222 field activities recorded for the Prime Minister.

It is evident that the ministers who implemented the most field and office activities during the last six months from the date 2023/04/12 - 2023/10/11, in order, are: Tawfiq Kreishan, Mohammad Salameh" Al-Nabulsi, Azmi Mahafzah, Khaled Al Hanifat, Yousef Al Shamali, Wafa Bani Mustafa, Ahmad Hanandeh, Haifa Al-Najjar, Kholoud Saqqaf, Maher Abuelsamen, Mohammad Al Khalayleh. It is worth noting that the methodology of preparing the report excluded the Minister of Foreign Affairs, State Ministers, the Official Government Spokesperson, the



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Minister of Political and Parliamentary Affairs, the Minister of Transport, the Minister of Water and Irrigation, and the Minister of Labor from the count of activities due to the nature of their work and their appointment dates.

The monitoring team worked on tracking the official ministry pages on the Facebook platform during the period (2022/04/12-11/10/2023). The results indicated that the total number of posts during that period was 10,308 posts. The number of views for those posts exceeded 77 million views, while the number of people who interacted with these posts (likes, comments, shares) was 808 thousand people, representing approximately 1% of the total number of viewers of all the posts.

The analysis results showed that the Ministry of Local Administration had the highest number of posts, reaching 3,308 posts, while the Ministry of Foreign Affairs had only one post. Regarding the total number of interactions with the posts, the results showed that the Ministry of Education had the highest number of interactions, with approximately 313 thousand interactions.

Analyzing the ministers after three years, it was found that the number of ministers in the Al-Khasawneh government over three years was 58 ministers. It was also found that 9 ministers who were part of the initial formation of Dr. Bishr Al-Khasawneh's government retained their positions through 7 amendments to the government, resulting in a total of 48 male ministers and 10 female ministers joining the government. By classifying the ministers who entered through the amendments, it was found that 7 ministers entered through the amendments and left through the amendments.
